## Image 4: Plain CT brain – 25/female

**Question:** What is the clinical suspicion in this patient presented to emergency with history of trauma; little more enquiries from the witness revealed that patient has a seizure like symptoms just before the fall.

## **Answer for Image 4:**

This patient has hemorrhagic foci with edema at left frontoparietal region which can be passed off as hemorrhagic contusion; however note the density of the superior sagittal sinus region which is more denser than expected. This patient has confirmed as venous sinus thrombosis and the left front parietal lobe changes are actually hemorrhagic venous infarct. Clinician and Radiologists should always look for clues that will help in reaching the appropriate diagnosis.
