What is the most likely clinical presentation?

What other imaging investigations to be requested?

**Answer 6 :**

the CT scan shows thin flap at proximal descending aorta - hall mark finding in aortic dissection..

A hypertensive patient with severe back pain and chest pain with asymmetric arm BP is typical presentation; CT angiogram timing and thin resolution images is necessary to make the acute diagnosis. In this scan, the ascending aorta is not involvement – stanford B type.
